Executive Director's Report – Brad Wood, CVP Executive Director

Central Visitation Program experienced growth in many ways during 2015. Among the highlights:


- Increased service Central Visitation provided over 1,600 hours of supervised parenting time in 2015, providing services to 128 families and 192 children.
- Expanded hours Last fall Central Visitation Program decided to open on Monday evenings, increasing program capacity for visits.
- Expanded volunteer power During 2015 Central Visitation Program utilized interns and expanded volunteer recruitment efforts, resulting in 1,634 visits and 392 exchanges during the year.
- Expanded visits The additional person power allowed Central Visitation Program to offer additional time to families, who normally were limited to one hour a week due to staffing constraints.
- Expanded ways to give A spring fundraiser was added, bring in over \$3,000 to support program services. Central Visitation Program started using Square to accept both client payments and donations year round.
- Expanded donor opportunities created the Caring Communities fund launched at the fall fundraiser, with over \$1,700 donated by December to help homeless or indigent parents see their children.


This growth resulted in an almost 60% increase in revenue for 2015! Although Central Visitation Program ended the year with a slight deficit, this was projected by the board as 2015 was meant to be a growing year. The board is projecting a balanced budget for 2016.
