



Gift Giving Policy

The following are the **only** days that you may bring gifts to your child. Please do not ask the staff to make any exceptions.

Valentine's Day	Halloween	Thanksgiving
Easter	Christmas	Fourth of July
Hanukah	Birthday	School Graduation
Religious Celebrations (such as First Communion, Bar/Bat Mitzvah)		

All gifts must be appropriate for the holiday or occasion. School clothes, school supplies, and basic needs items (shoes, diapers, etc.) are exempt from the gift giving policy and may be gifted in moderation. Cash is never appropriate, but gift cards are acceptable. **All gifts must be brought unwrapped and will be checked for appropriateness by the staff.** All cards must remain unsealed until approved by the staff. Once approved you may wrap the present and seal the card.

All gifts brought to the Center will go home with the Child. The Center will not allow a child to receive a gift and then be told that they cannot take it home with them. The Center also will not allow the custodial or non-custodial parent to determine what gifts may be taken home with the child.

The visiting child has the right to refuse any gifts from the non-residential parent. The non-residential parent will not pressure or try to guilt the child into taking any gifts that the child does not want to accept.

I have read and understand this policy and agree to abide by it. If I do not understand any part of this policy I will ask that it be explained further. I further agree that if I do not follow this policy that my services may be terminated by Central Visitation Program.
